Twelve New Professors Join This Year's Faculty

Miss Margaret C. Ford has been appointed Registrar of Manhattanville College.

Miss Ford, who holds the B.A. degree from Notre Dame College, Staten Island, received her master's degree in history from the Faculty of Political Science of Columbia University in 1952. Before joining the administrative staff of Manhattanville as Assistant Registrar in

1958, Miss Ford was head of the Department of History and of the senior school at the Riverside Country Day School. She succeeds, as Registrar of Manhattanville, Mother Gertrude Brady, R.S.C.J., who has assumed the post of Director of Admissions.

Twelve faculty members are also beginning their work at Manhattanville this fall.

The art department now includes Miss Alice Adams and Mrs. Roger Barnes. Miss Adams has a B.F.A. from Columbia University in their school of painting and sculpture. She has studied at Albusson, France. (Continued on P. 4)

"Catholic responsibility in a pluralistic society" is the NFCCCS study project for the year. Getting rid of the so-called 'ghetto mentality' among Catholics is our aim," says Mary Ann, who served as Manhattanville's Senior NF delegate last year.

The previous regional president was elected executive vice-president of the national organization at this convention.
