Founded 1938

The N.F.C.C.S., founded by a Manhattanville student in 1938, is an organization of American Catholic college students whose purpose is to foster campus activities, to bring together on a common ground Catholic students' attitude major issues of the day. The Federation functions through regional districts which are directly related to national headquarters at Cincinnati, Ohio. Policies of the Federation are formulated by the delegates themselves who represent their colleges at regular regional meetings. The delegates elect regional officers who plan and direct meetings throughout the year.

The N.F.C.C.S. has succeeded in setting up "homerooms" on various campuses which exist as focal points for all N.F.C.C.S. activities. Religious groups, such as Peace Group and Interracial Group, are then more easily advised and assisted. Booklets and pamphlets published by the N.F.C.C.S. find their way to students through the "homeroom."

The Advisory Board members have chosen Mary Rita Madden '44, Jeanne Lawson '45, and Kay Wallace '46 to act as delegates to N.F.C.C.S. meetings.
